### **Abstract**

Fair and differential proceedings of crimes against the environment is essential in order to fulfill the requirements of environmental rights. One of the areas where the criminalization of the criminal justice system must be discriminated in its territory is crimes of a green nature, since the need for comprehensive criminal protection of the environment which is one of the requirements for the protection of the environment, is more necessary to differentiation this field than ever.
